WORRY

LEARNING

On the way to the tomb – the gospel of Mark records the women discussing the obstacles they would face when they got there namely the stone in front of the tomb. Implicit also is the fact that there would be Roman soldiers there. They hadn't arrived and yet they were concerned about the unknown and the uncertainty of what they faced ahead of them.

REFLECTING

What in your life is unknown and uncertain causing you to worry about the future?

What about your life is a stone blocking your way or a soldier preventing you from moving forward?

LEARNING

Through the wondrous love of God – He engages our broken world by His grace (gently meeting us where we are at) and by His glory (triumphantly proclaiming resurrection). A glory that triumphs beyond the temporal views of how it happened and into the majestic mystery of a wow that it did happen. In gratitude we respond with worship. A worship that takes the focus – and the power – away from the worries of life and towards a worship of the life giver.

REFLECTING

What parts of your life are worshipping experiences of God – that you end up clinging to more than worshipping God Himself?

What response would you have in meeting the resurrected Jesus?
