Scripture: Acts 2: 42-47 // Deuteronomy 6: 4-9

Date: July 5, 2020

### **DESIRED**

#### *TEACHING*

The early church in Acts 2 had seen the power of God through the signs and wonders of the Holy Spirit. They had also heard the proclamation of the gospel of Jesus Christ through Peter's sermon. The people were eager to hear more of this God and they were eager to know more of this God.

#### *REFLECTIONS*

What questions do you have of who God is?

What questions do you have of who you are to God?

### **DEVOTED**

#### *TEACHING*

The people chose to be devoted to this learning from the apostles. They made themselves available and hungered to know more of who this Jesus was and how he lived His life for God.

#### *REFLECTING*

Where in your life are you hungry to know more of God?

Where in your life is God calling you to grow in your devotion to learn more of Him?

### **DISCIPLED**

#### *TEACHING*

A disciple is to be someone who is a learner. A learner who is intentional about what they want to know more about and who they are learning it from. Yet faith formation is not something easily measured by a ruler or by a certificate.

#### *REFLECTING*

What signs or measurements indicate that you are growing in your faith?

Where in your life do you desire to know more of God's calling for you?

Where in your life are you able to be a teacher of God's truths to others?



**WALL # 1 – GOD**

*TEACHING - BUILDING*

The first wall represents a growth of God  
Anchored through worship of this God  
God was revealed to the first century church through Jesus  
God incarnate – fully God and also fully human

Teaching – healing – living live obedient to the law (in love)  
Teaching of the kingdom  
Teaching of forgiveness

What are some of the things you've wanted to ask about God?

**WALL # 2 – US**

*TEACHING - BUILDING*

The second wall represents a learning of ourselves  
Last week we looked at Isaiah 6 and saw how Isaiah learned about who he was – in  
comparison to the holy God of Israel  
It represents a growing understanding of who God made us to be  
It represent a growing understanding of what God is calling us to do

*QUESTIONS*

What are some of your strengths from God?  
How might they be best applied

**WALL # 3 – CULTURE**

*TEACHING – BUILDING*

The third wall represents culture  
Learning the brokenness of the world around us  
Learning about the redemption of God in and for the world around us

*QUESTIONS*

What part of the broken world most breaks your heart?  
What part of the redeemed world most gives you hope?

**WALL # 4 – CONNECTIONS**

The fourth wall – is a connection wall  
Learning how you intersect with culture  
Learning how you intersect with God in culture
